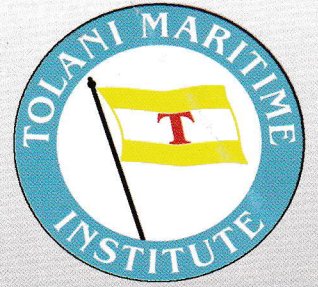
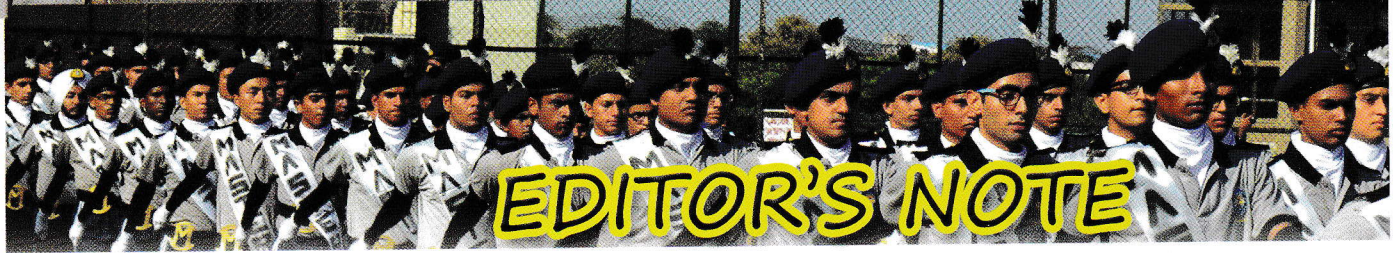

This led to the emergence of a dream, a dream which was fulfilled with her courage, hardworking attitude and never die spirit. Here’s a look at one of the most inspiring stories of TMI.....

## ALUMNI SPEAK

**Why Merchant Navy?**

My father was a chief engineer and since childhood I have been hearing anecdotes about ship and the adventurous life of a seafarer. I sailed with him on a couple of ships before joining school. So since that time I had a soft corner in my heart for ships and the shipping industry. As I grew up, I realized that my passion was to work with my own hands. So when time came to choose my career, there was no choice better than merchant navy for satisfying my spirit of adventure.

**Mam, tell us something about your hobbies.**

My hobbies include reading and attending camps for trekking. I have learnt Indian classical dance, bharatnatyam, for 7 years. I also TOOK 4 exams of the Trinity College, in London in effective communication speech and drama.

**How difficult was it to deal with this highly based ratio of men and women in this industry?**

Being a woman in a male dominated industry is no piece of cake. It was tough for me to adjust to the environment in the beginning because I came from an all-girls school. But TMI groomed and moulded us for what was coming next. At TMI, every division had a single girl amongst 39 boys. So we got used to attending classes, doing workshop practices, welding and physical training with all the boys. The teachers always treated us equal to all the boys and inculcated in us that feeling too. The staff at TMI motivated us continuously and supported in all aspects.



**How have your experiences been onboard a ship?**

The real challenge started when I joined my first ship. When I went to the engine room for the first time it, was so huge with gigantic machinery that I was really amazed. First few days were tough. I had to get used to the environment on the ship, the physical running around that had to be done, the hectic schedule at ports, watch keeping, and emergency preparedness.

**Were there moments when you questioned your decision of joining the merchant navy?**

Questions? No, not really. I felt a little dejected when I realized I was lacking in physical strength compared to my colleagues. The first time I held a spanner to open a nut, it would not budge. I was feeling lost and wondering how I could go forward like this. But senior engineers in Teekay Tankers took me under their wings and told me that in this field it's not about strength but about applying your engineering mind to it. They taught me the trick of the trade. They put their trust in me and gave me all their support as I learned to work with my hands. I learnt how to overhaul machinery like purifiers and pumps and finally learnt the knack of troubleshooting. It was a gradual process that needed a lot of patience, but as time passed I became confident and the moment a purifier gave an alarm, I would get it working again. The joy and happiness was intangible.

**You credit your success to...**

My success in this field is because of the undying support of my parents and family who never stopped me and let go of me. They helped me follow my dreams and made me capable of working independently and confidently. Last, but not the least, my company- Teekay Shipping- was always supportive. The seafarers are given the best quality of training and our problems are understood while being provided with the solution.

**Any advice to all those aspiring girl cadets?**

My advice to the girl cadets joining this industry is that when you go onboard, be professional. Your attitude and behaviour decides how others will behave with you. Be confident and patient and never give up. Believe in yourself and the fact that you are equal to men in all aspects. You have to prove yourself at every point. There is no shortcut to success, but that just brings out the best in you.

Once you find your passion, follow your heart and success will be at your doorstep.

**What are your future plans?**

I aspire to become a chief engineer and continue in this field because of the opportunity and confidence that Teekay has given me to fulfill my dream.

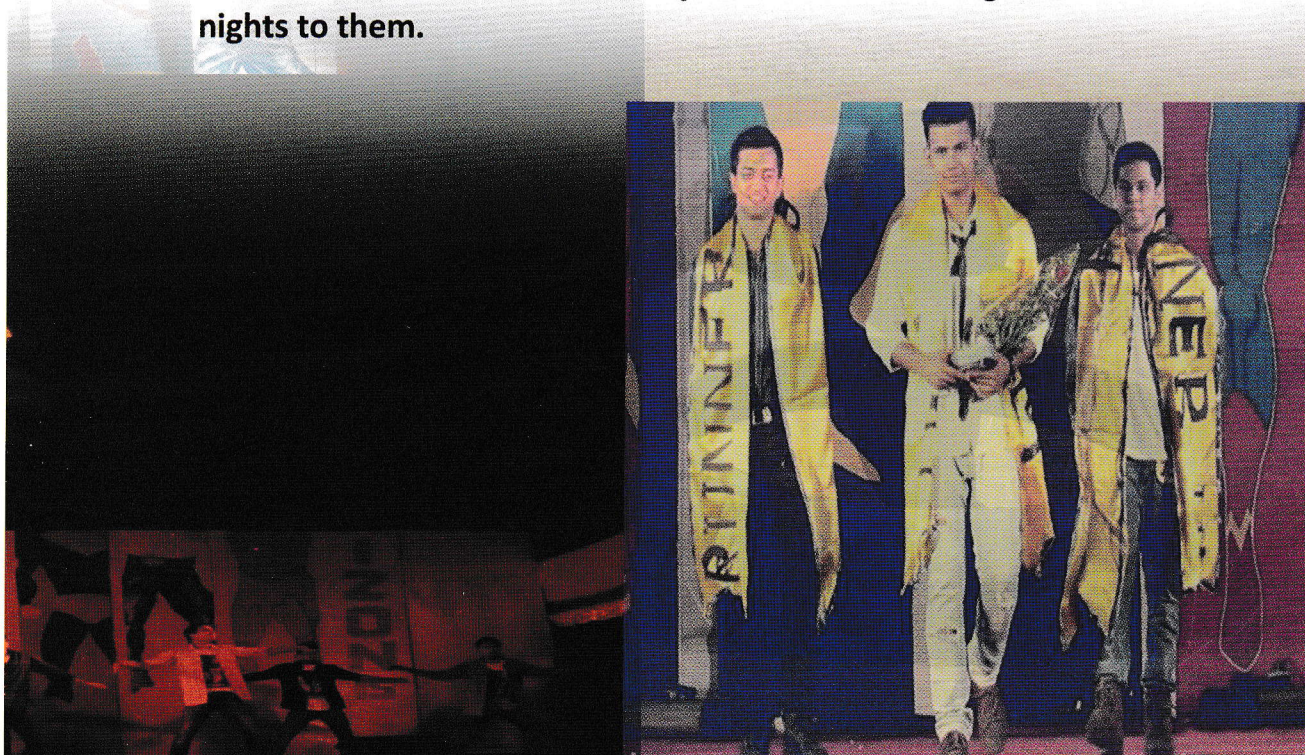

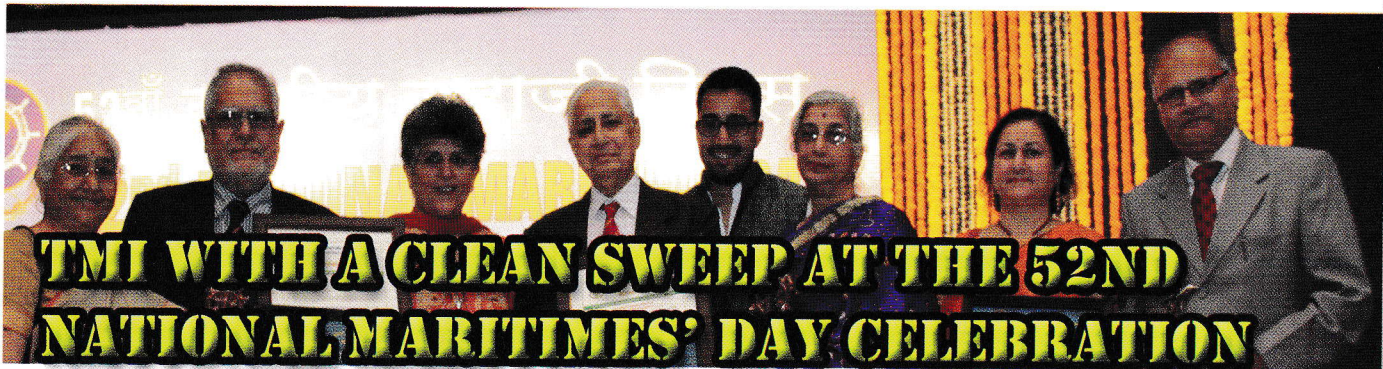




**MPHRP REGIONAL DIRECTOR WINS SEAFARERS' WELFARE PERSONALITY OF THE YEAR AWARD**

## World's largest port operators join forces for the environment

'Go Green' is the first ever joint environmental initiative between DP World, Hutchison Port Holding Limited, APM Terminals, PSA Terminals, Shanghai International Port Group and Port of Rotterdam Authority. This initiative aimed to promote environmental awareness and make a sustainable difference in the communities in which they operate. They campaigned between the 14th and the 21st of September, 2015. A range of activities covering themes of 'Re-use', 'Recycling' and 'Climate Change And The Communities' were organised by the participating port operators' local business units to tackle and raise awareness.

## Carnival Cruise Ship fire leaves guests stranded on Caribbean island

On 7th September, 2015, an engine fire onboard a cruise ship, operated by Carnival Corp left about 4,500 passengers and crew stranded in the U.S. Virgin Islands forcing the cruise operator to cut the trip short. The Carnival Liberty departed from San Juan, Puerto Rico, for a seven day Caribbean Cruise with 3,346 guests and 1,150 crew on board. A day into the week-long cruise, the fire broke out. The fire was extinguished by the ship's automated suppression system. No guests or crew were injured.

## Maersk ports unit buys 11 terminals to expand container capacity

Port operator APM Terminals, part of Denmark's A.P. Moller-Maersk, is buying 11 container ports from Spanish Shipping and logistics group Perez y Cia to boost its presence in emerging markets and better serve bigger container vessels. This deal, which was signed on 8th September, 2015 in Copenhagen will increase APM Terminals' container ports from 63 to 74. The deal's enterprise value is estimated to be in the vicinity of €1.35 billion (\$1.5 billion). APM Terminals is the world's third largest container port operator after Singapore state-owned PSA International and Hutchison Port Holding, a unit of Hong Kong-based CK Hutchison Holdings Ltd

## NYK establishes First exclusive RORO Terminal in Saudi

On September 3, NYK signed a joint-venture agreement with Ports Development Company (PDC) to establish NYK's first exclusive RORO terminal operating company at King Abdullah port (KAP) on the Red Sea coast of Saudi Arabia. It is planned to commence operations by third quarter of 2016. This will be the first automotive logistics base for the NYK in the Middle East.

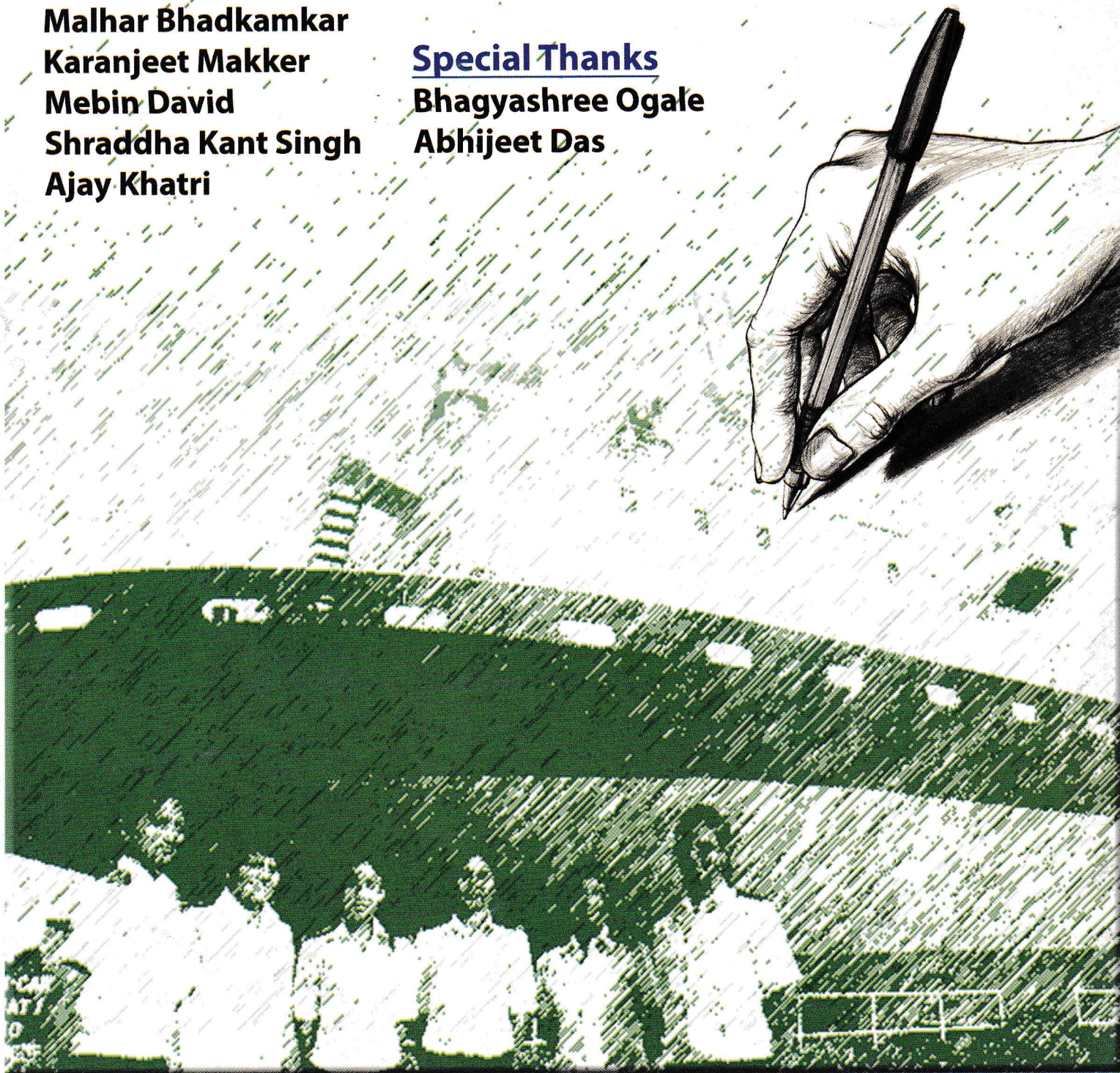
