Rendezvous with Dr. B. K. Saxena

The education of a man isn't counted in the degrees he has amassed. It's measured in the countless lives that he has touched and nurtured by his own hands. From his humble beginnings as a DMET Cadet, an eager First Year waiting to challenge the ways of the world - to one of the finest seafarers this country has produced - onto a United Nations Delegate - and finally an academic mentor who started off at the World Maritime University and now closes a chapter as the Principal at the Tolani Maritime Institute. Just as ecstatic, he enters the first year of yet another chapter.

Heartiest congratulations on the brilliant tenure that you've had here at TMI, Sir. Everything that has happened here has been possible because of you. Please tell us, how has this journey been?

Well, thank you. This journey has been an exciting learning experience. Especially, with the challenge of coming up to a place where you are going to start something from a scratch as opposed to a place where it has already been set up and the job is just to run it. When I came here, there was a vision - Dr. Tolani's vision - and I too had a vision for the place. Today, it is a good feeling

Sir, how did this entire process take place? How did TMI happen to you?

Well, I didn't join right in the beginning. I joined a month and a half after the inception of the institute while it had just started at Sharda Centre in Pune. There was a vacancy for the post of a Principal and my name was proposed. At that time I was DGM at the Shipping Corporation's Training Academy. It was a brilliant job and I was very comfortable and content with my life. I wasn't even thinking of quitting since I'd been there for well over 30 years. Also, I hadn't ever worked with Tolani Shipping, but I had heard of Dr. Tolani and his integrity, with the way he made things work

So how was the transition from something so comfortable to such a 'work in progress'?

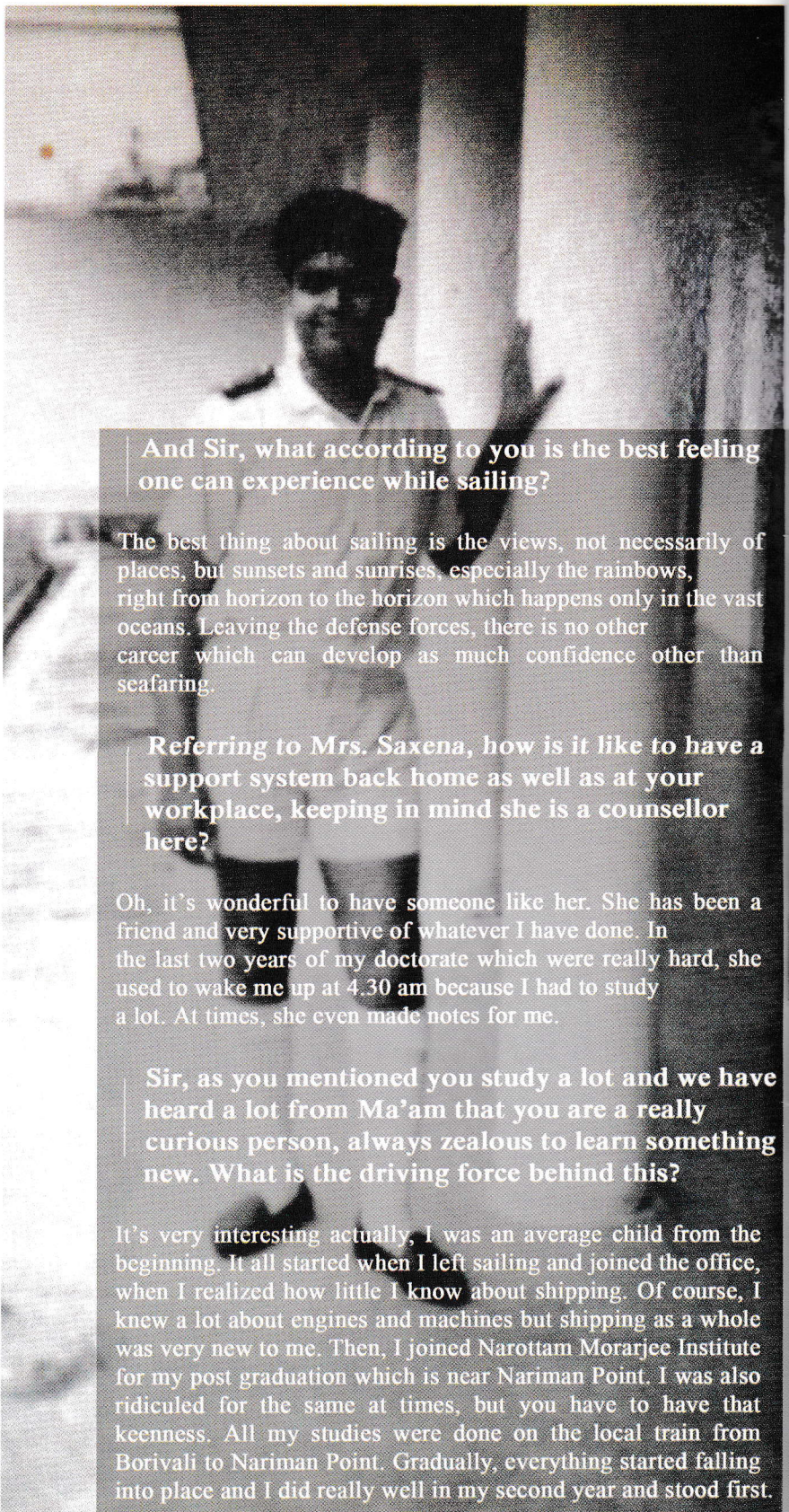
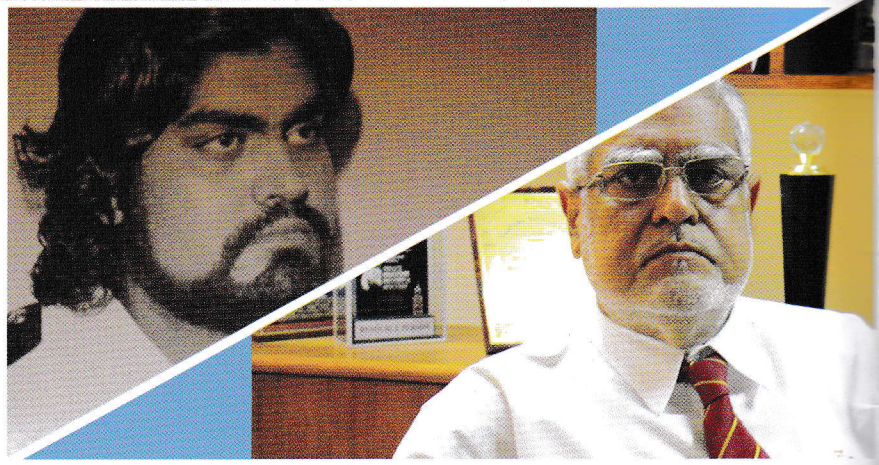
Initially, I had not consulted anyone except my wife about the offer. I had thought to myself that it would be the time to take a chance and see where things lead me. When the news came out, almost everyone thought I was making a big mistake by leaving such an amazing job for a place full of uncertainties. It was only my boss, the director of SCI, who was extremely positive about my endeavour in the private sector.

Sir, before you took up the administrative posts in Tolani and SCI, how was your sailing experience?

It was wonderful. I have sailed for almost 15 years after my graduation from DMET in '68. My first voyage lasted for 21 months. Infact, my wife sailed with me for 8 years. My first company was Jayanti Shipping which later merged with SCI and after 15 years of my sailing, I had started to feel rusty and the company came to know about my aspiration of being a superintendent.

I recall, you once told us, "You start believing in God once you start sailing." How is that?

Yes, that is what I have always stressed upon. In the young days, no one actually believes in God and I was no exception. But, once you are onboard ship and you see the huge ship being flung and tossed away at the mercy of the enormous waves, you realize that someone is controlling all this.



And Sir, what according to you is the best feeling one can experience while sailing?

The best thing about sailing is the views, not necessarily of places, but sunsets and sunrises, especially the rainbows, right from horizon to the horizon which happens only in the vast oceans. Leaving the defense forces, there is no other career which can develop as much confidence other than seafaring.

Referring to Mrs. Saxena, how is it like to have a support system back home as well as at your workplace, keeping in mind she is a counsellor here?

Oh, it's wonderful to have someone like her. She has been a friend and very supportive of whatever I have done. In the last two years of my doctorate which were really hard, she used to wake me up at 4.30 am because I had to study a lot. At times, she even made notes for me.

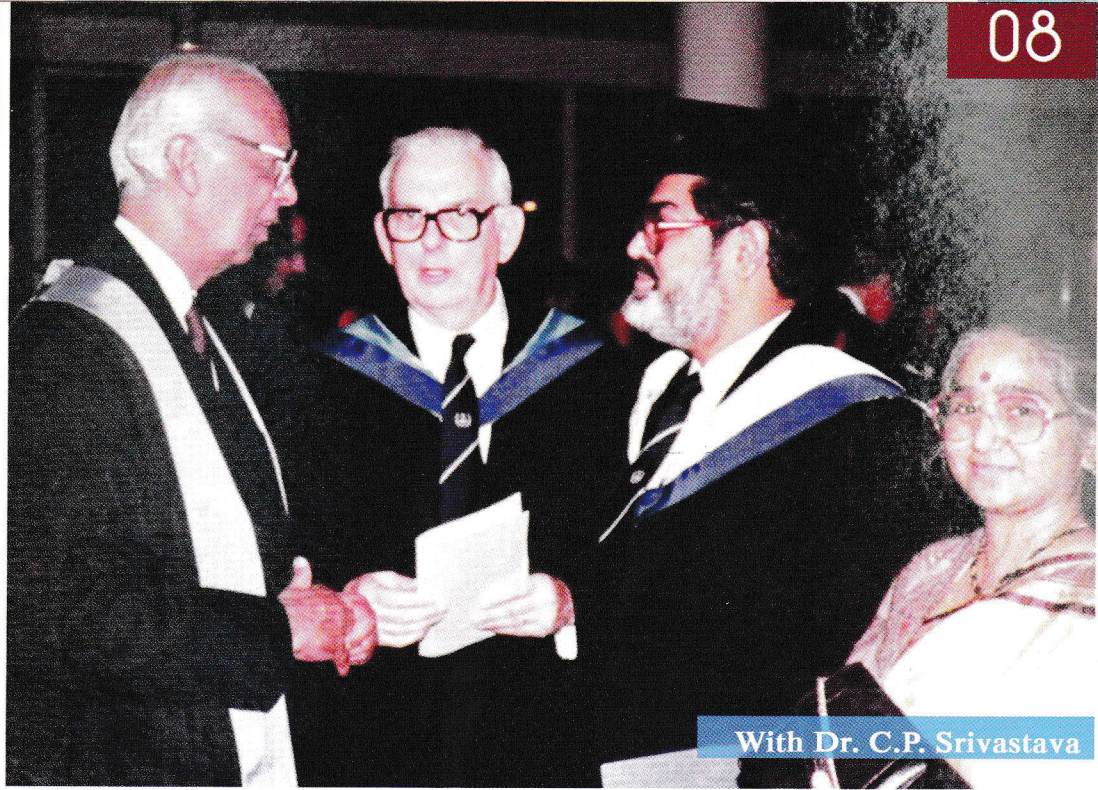
Sir, as you mentioned you study a lot and we have heard a lot from Ma'am that you are a really curious person, always zealous to learn something new. What is the driving force behind this?

It's very interesting actually, I was an average child from the beginning. It all started when I left sailing and joined the office, when I realized how little I know about shipping. Of course, I knew a lot about engines and machines but shipping as a whole was very new to me. Then, I joined Narottam Morarjee Institute for my post graduation which is near Nariman Point. I was also ridiculed for the same at times, but you have to have that keenness. All my studies were done on the local train from Borivali to Nariman Point. Gradually, everything started falling into place and I did really well in my second year and stood first.

Sir, is there any specific passion that you haven't done till now, but are passionate about and want to pursue?

Indeed, there are two regrets. My father was in the army and hence, he was ardent that even I join the same. So, I went for the SSB once but couldn't make it. The second being LLB, for which I tried two years back, I passed some of the entrance tests but failed some, as at a certain age your understanding really deepens but the memory starts lagging, therefore, I had to give up.

What is your perception regarding the upcoming changes the college is going through, like the change in affiliation and then the change in the hierarchy?

Actually, I think being a part of the IMU is a bit better as we are now in the mainstream unlike the BITS affiliation. So, in the long run, I think it is a good move. Regarding the latter part of your question, any institute which is people driven should have a decentralization at some intervals, keeping in mind a large number of employees. In 2005, we brought in the concept of programme chairs. We have been talking about this the to-come hierarchy for quite some time and with my departure, it was more convenient to do the same.

Sir, it has been almost 20 years of this college and the busy routine of yours. Now, with your parting, you will have a totally different life. How will you manage that?

I'll be quite forward to it because in the last few years I barely had anytime to spare for me. I'll be definitely not taking up a job but, I'll still be busy with many bodies like Institute of Engineers, Institute of Marine Engineers, Indian Ship Owners Association etc. The routine definitely would become a bit better, at least I won't be getting up at 5.30 am anymore!

What will you miss the most about TMI?

I would miss the environment the most, and by environment, I just don't mean the climate or nature but the totality of TMI. I really enjoy watching the cadets and talking to them as I can relate the younger me to them. I think it'll be hard leaving all this behind and getting accustomed to the city life.

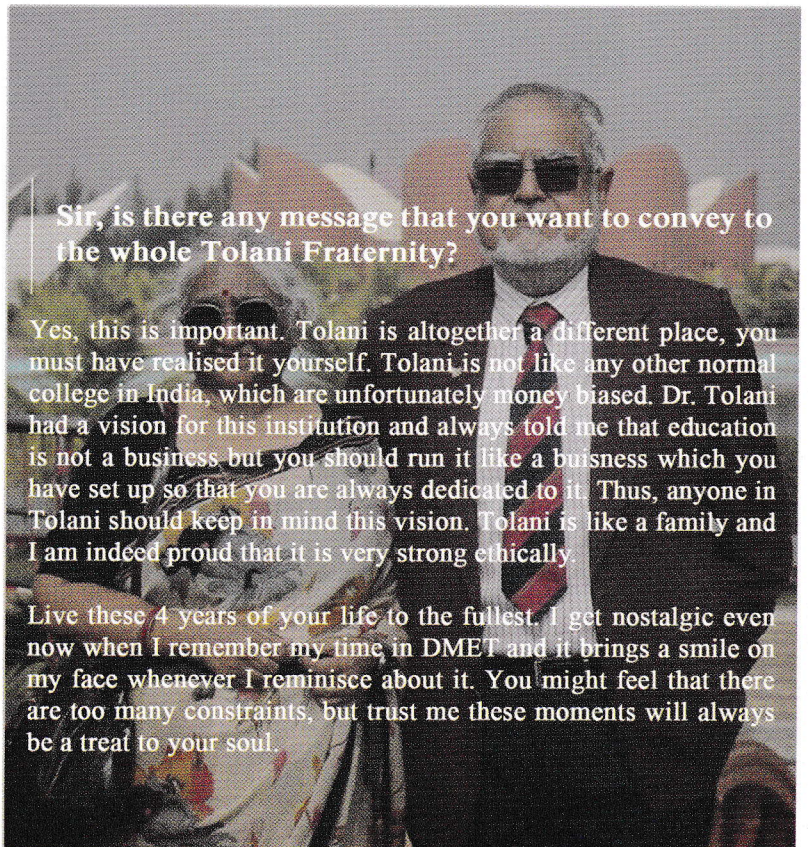

The 11th version of Transtech was held from 08th to 10th March 2018. It was organized by Tolani Maritime Institute in association with The Institute of Marine Engineers (India), Pune Branch & The Institution of Engineers (India), Maharashtra State Centre. Transtech kicked off as the technical fest of Tolani in 2008 and has been providing a platform to a multiplicity of young minds since then. The word 'Transtech' is made up of 'transport' and 'technology', thus, Transtech called for paper presentations and model displays from throughout the country and witnessed zippy participation from various institutions.

The main theme for this year's Transtech was "Innovative Approach in Transportation - An Industry Life Line", with the sub themes being:

- Sagarmala Project - Complexities & Opportunities
- Integration of Inland waterways in Transportation
- Safety & Security in Transport Sector
- Emerging Trends in Robotics, Navigation, and communication
- Human Resources and Skill Development
- Environmental Challenges

TMI received 35 brilliant entries for paper presentation, out of which only 19 were selected and kept for the event. The papers were presented in the course of 2 days in 5 technical sessions. Along with this, 13 models were presented by various institutes and both, the models and papers were judged by a panel consisting of Mr. Anil Bhat, Ex-Chief Engineer with Mr. Ravindra Sudame, Ex-Radio Officer, Ex-Elect. Officer and Cdr. Bhaskar Walimbe, Faculty TMI.

The best part of this technical fest was the active partaking of many renowned dignitaries from the maritime industry. On 8th March, Day 1, Mr. Bhuvnesh Tyagi, Research Manager IOC, R&D Centre, Faridabad made an outstanding technical talk on "Engine Testing and Component Rating", This was trailed by an invited talk "Towards Clean Transportation through Materials Innovation" by the effervescent Dr. Satishchandra B. Ogale, Sr. Scientist and Professor, Indian Institute of Science Education and Research, Pune.

The notable bigwig for Day 1 was Mr. Pradeep T Rawat, Chairman - National Shipping Board, former MP. Mr. Pradeep Rawat released the Transtech 2018 CD, Book of Abstracts and the TMI Technical Bulletin. On the evening of 8th March, the participants and the institute was enthralled by Kathak performed by Ms. Rujuta Soman who is recognized by The Sangeet Natak Akademi Award and Kalidas Samman.

The guest speaker on Day 2, 9th March was Brig. Hemant Mahajan who shed some light on Maritime Security. Day 3, 10th March, beheld the interactive technical talk of Mr. TSR Chary, MD Green Sails Singapore on "Condition Monitoring Technologies". The Chief Guest for the day was Capt. Sudarsan Srinivasan, Director (Training), Synergy Maritime Recruitment Services, Mumbai. After all the sweat that was put in by the cadets, there were tokens of appreciation for the best out of best models and papers. After the valedictory address, Capt. 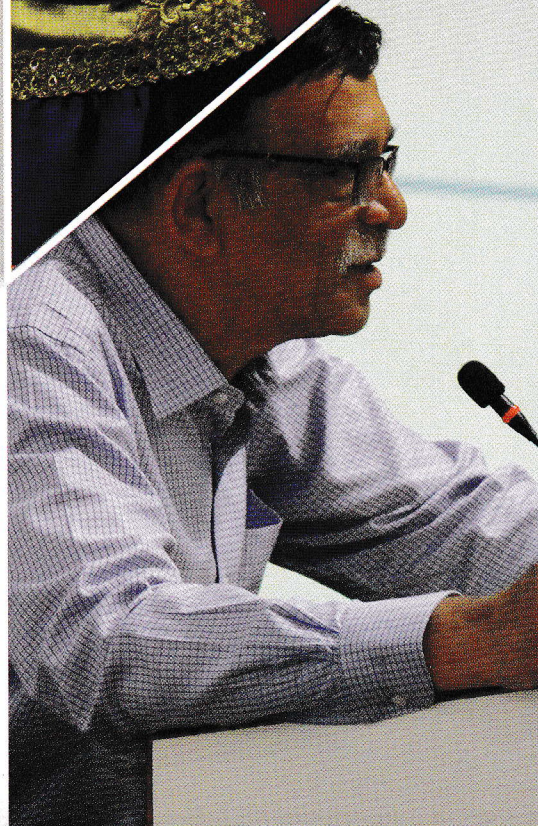

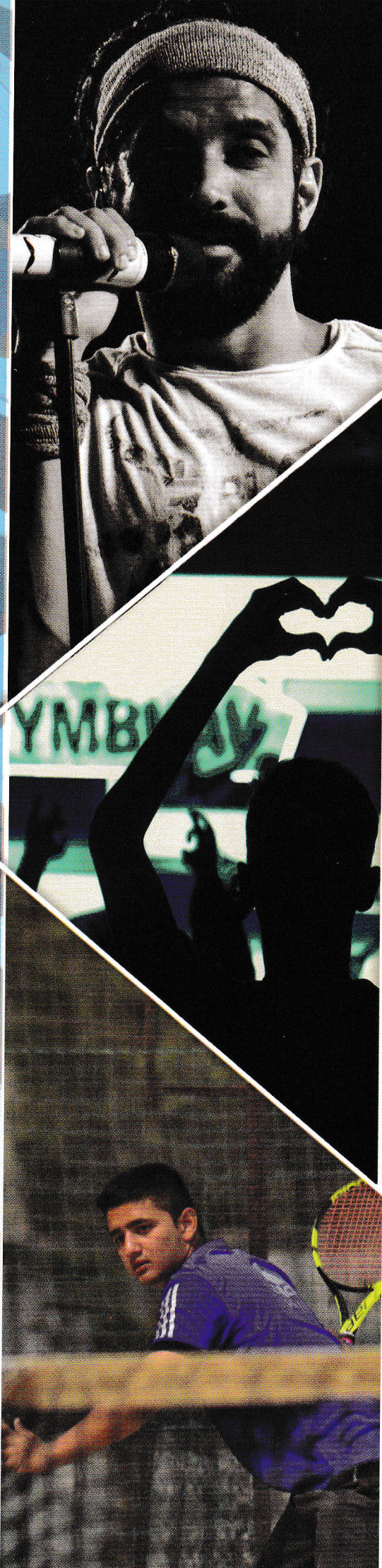

SIMS Olympiad 2018

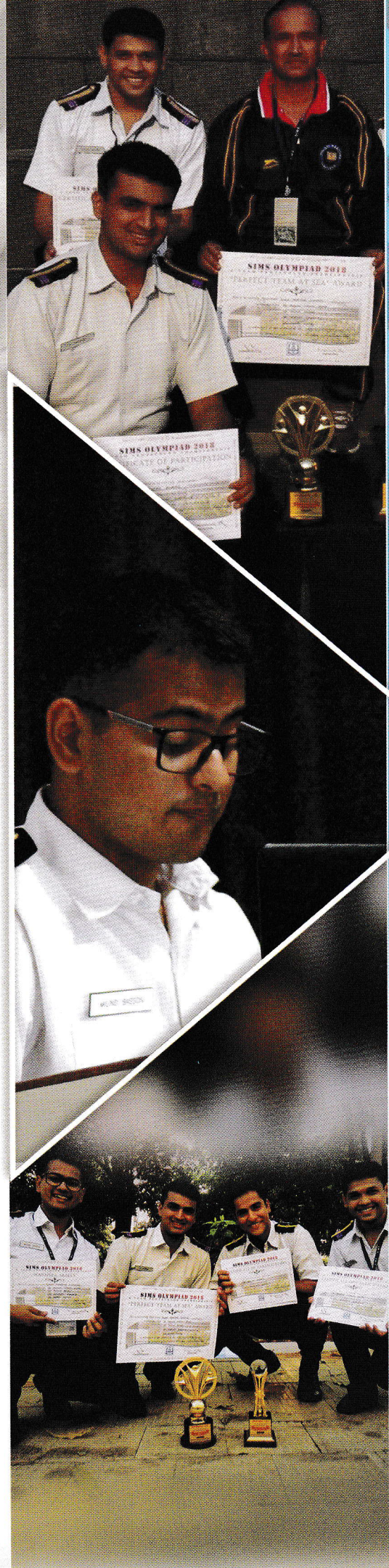

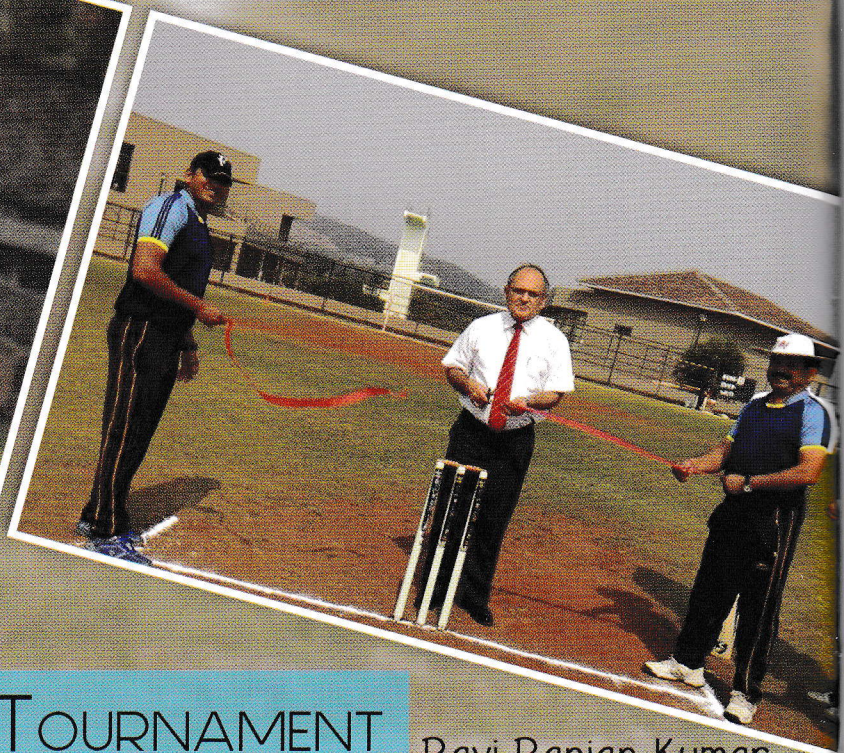
