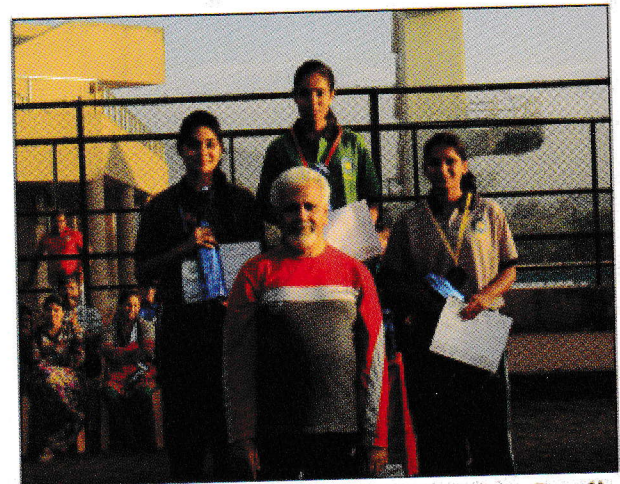

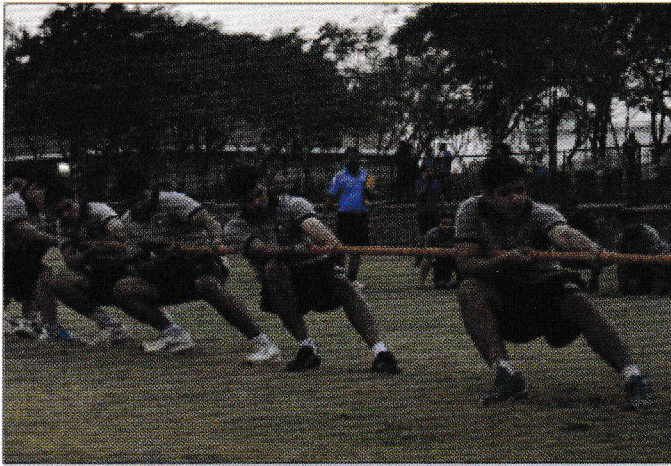
TUG OF WAR

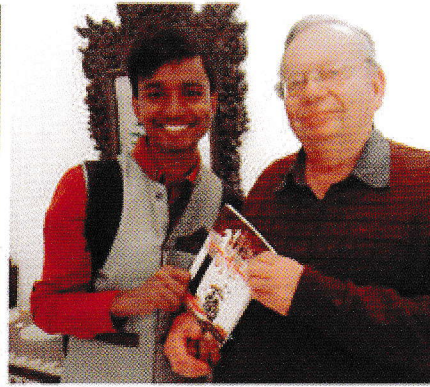

IIT BOMBAY'S MOOD INDIGO

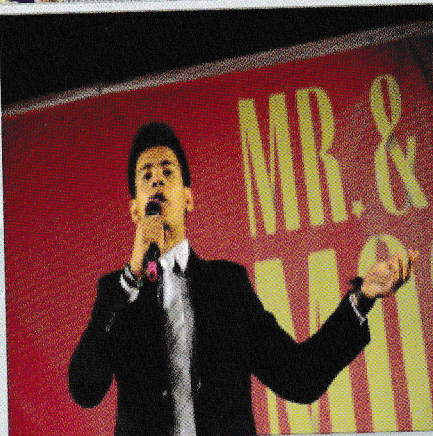
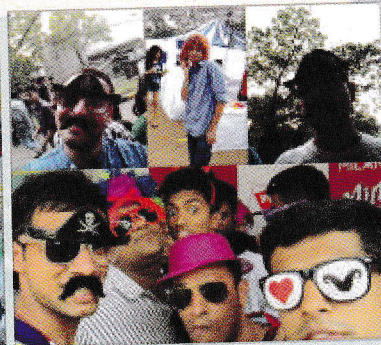

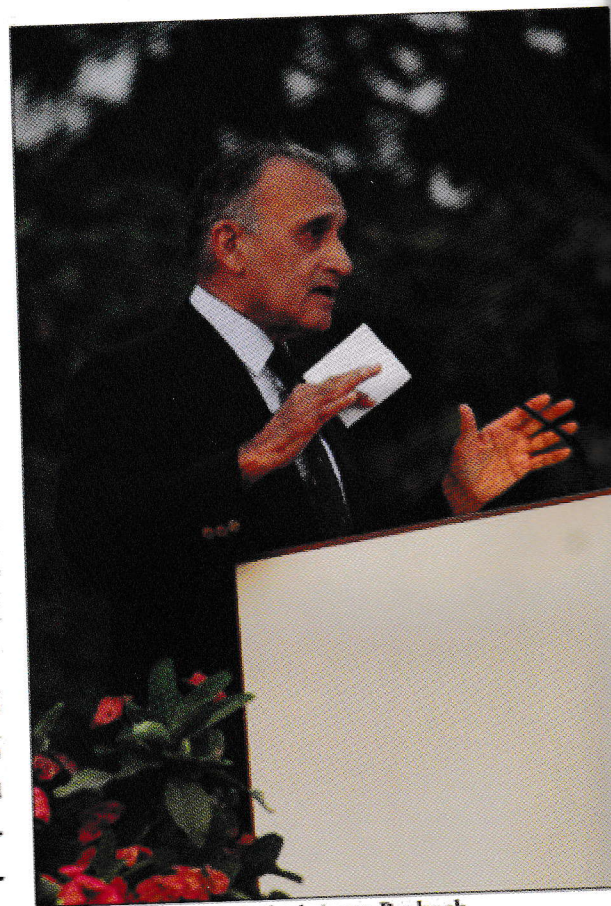
of Group Discussion, a Talent round and a personal Q&A round.

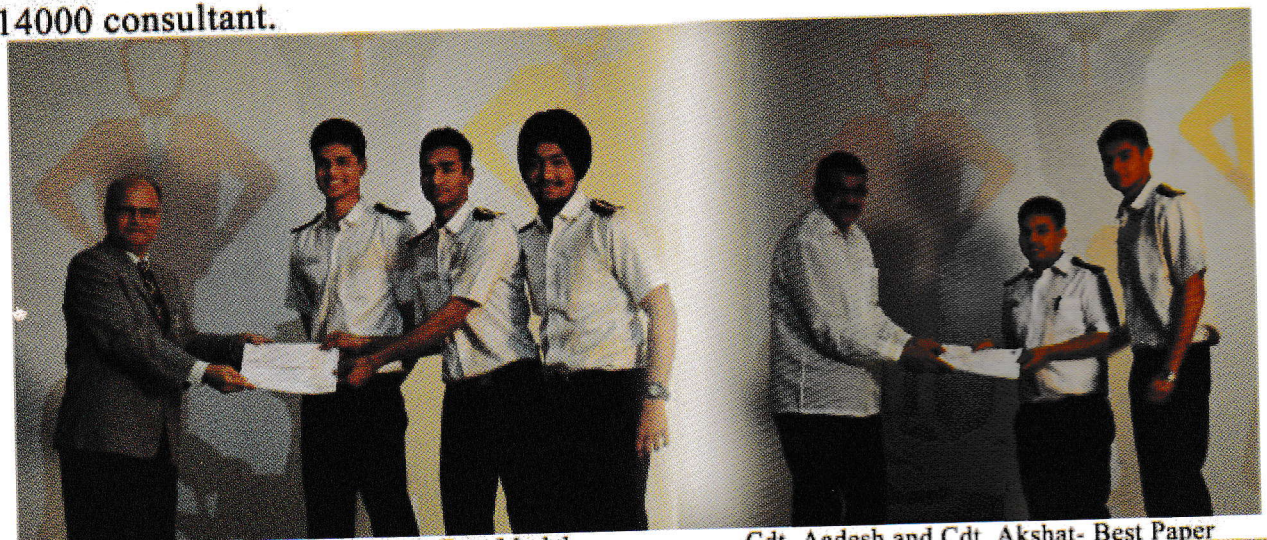
