The best part of merchant navy has always been visiting different countries and fascinating places like Disneyland, going around Europe, to name a few and having parties with family while they were onboard.



Good morning Sir. Thank you for giving us your precious time. At the outset, we would like to congratulate you on your tenure at TMI.

Please tell us about your journey starting from your childhood, family background and upbringing to your schooling and then the marine life.

I was born in a middle class family and did my schooling till Class 4th, in a very remote place called Chandrapur near Nagpur.

Then I joined the Sainik School in Bijapur in Karnataka and completed my Class 11th from there. Back then we didn't have a Class 12th, so to pursue any professional course we had to go through a BSC at first. I did my BSC in Mathematics and then, went on to pursue Mechanical Engineering from a Government College in Amravati in 1977 till 1981. After this, I did my GME course of 1 Year from MERI Mumbai and started my shipping career with Shipping Corporation of India. After clearing my Class 1, I joined Anglo Eastern Shipping in 1990 and sailed till 1996. I left sailing due to my father's ill-health. I moved on to teaching and joined a local engineering college as lecturer.

And later on I got my Master's Degree in Thermal Power Engineering from the same college. I joined Anglo Eastern in the year 2000 during my return and did 3 contracts as a 2nd Engineer and 1 contract as Chief Engineer, after which I left sailing permanently.

I joined Tolani Maritime Institute in the year 2005 as a senior assistant lecturer.

How was your experience at sea? Can you tell us about some of the more memorable moments?

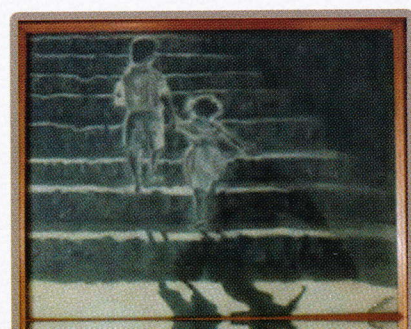
The best part has always been visiting different countries and fascinating places like Disneyland, Madam Tussaud's, going around Europe, to name a few and having parties with family while they were onboard. We ended up catching 20 kilos of fish near Las Palmas during our stay at the port. I loved the challenges that came with my job. Back then the ships weren't automated and more than half the tasks that are managed by machines were done by me manually - which helped me learn a lot. One voyage that I remember very well was when we sailed from Vancouver to Mumbai. Unwittingly, it became a voyage of 48 days and we had to go through 8 storms. It was a rough time.

You have been the driving force behind Transtech. Could you tell us how you managed to get such quality papers and also how you manage such an event so smoothly?

About getting quality papers, the credit goes to the Cadets. I am just an intermediate. I only guide them and try to sort out their problems and help them make effective papers. I would like to see more and more cadets participating in the years to come because it's a great platform for people to learn. Coming to the management of the event, I've always had a great team - from the faculty members to the student coordinator - which has worked in perfect in coordination to make work easier for everyone. The faculty have always been enthusiastic with taking up their work and just left me with the job of checking the status of different things. Everyone participating over the years, has given their best to make this event a successful one and I can't ask for more than this.

**Can you tell us about your time at Sainik School?**

I fought with my parents to leave Chandarpur and go to Sainik School during my middle schooling years. They were skeptical since we didn't have the financial resources to support my education there. I managed to convince them after I got a scholarship of ₹220 and finally got my admission there. I used to miss home whenever my dad used to come to leave me after a Vacation. I always felt like running behind him to go back home again. At Sainik School we were always occupied and kept so busy with sports, preparatory classes, school academics that we didn't have time to miss anyone after a while. To add to it, all of it was compulsory even watching a movie too! Initially I was very shy, but with my time there, I got involved with sports and managed to become a top sportsman. I love basketball and the love for the sport still carries on to this day. I remember even playing a game with the Cadets here, during the last semester. My favourite entertainment was the radio and I still cherish listening to it while driving. Back then there was a program called Geetmala which had a countdown of the best songs of the week and the year end special, where they played the best songs of the year, was the most anticipated time of our stay.

**How was your experience at TMI?**

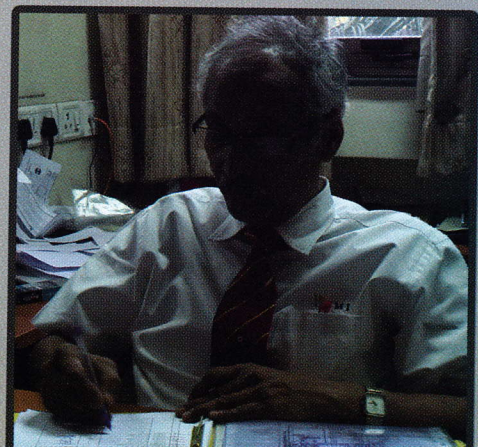
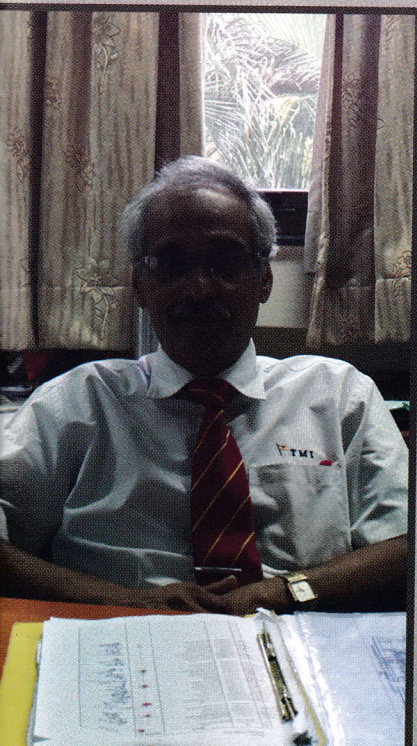
I had a great experience teaching here and have made many memories. The people here are excellent and they've made my tenure, one of the most ecstatic ones. I wish TMI all the luck.

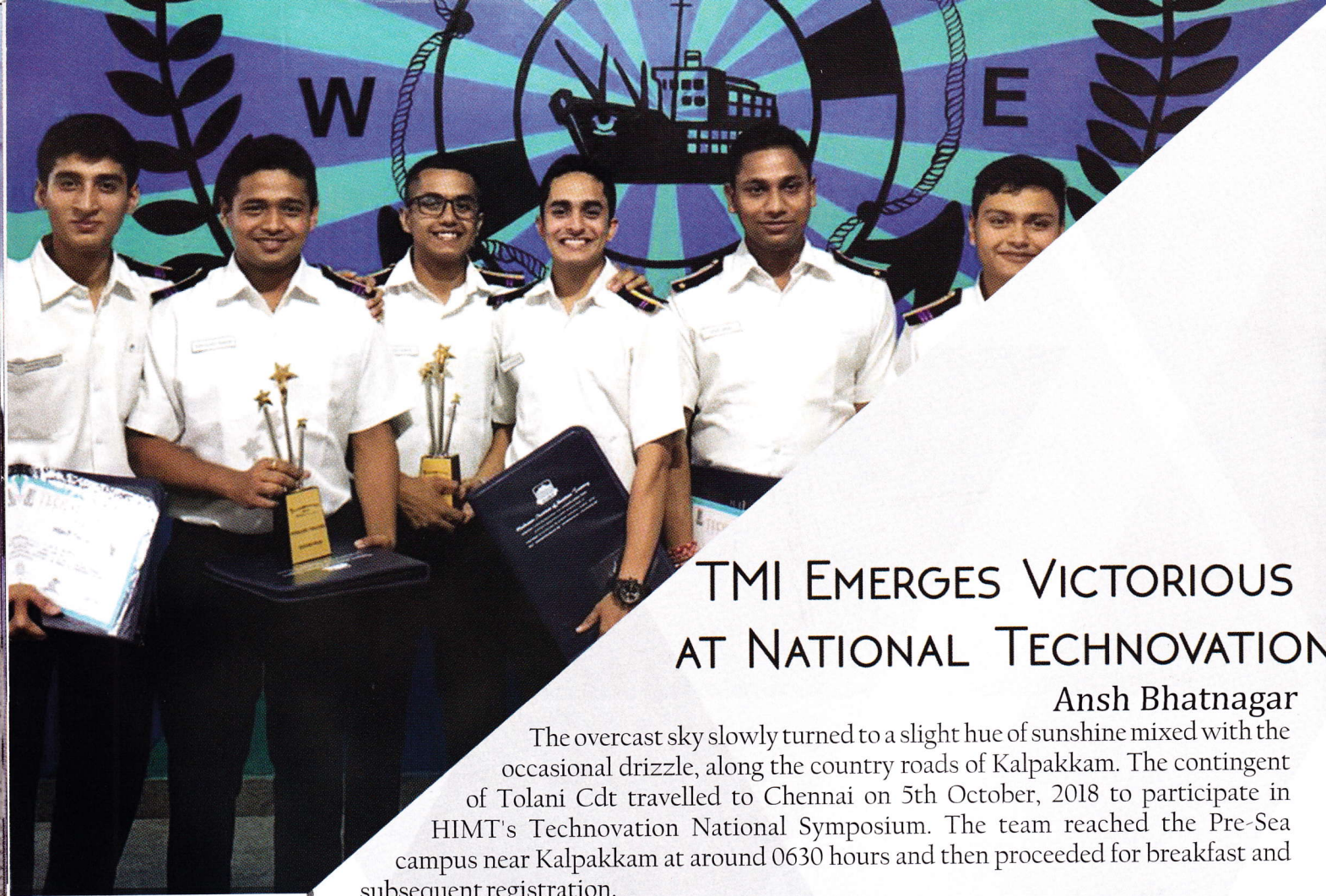
**What plans do you have for your retirement?**

## POONAWALA CLEAN CITY MARATHON 2018

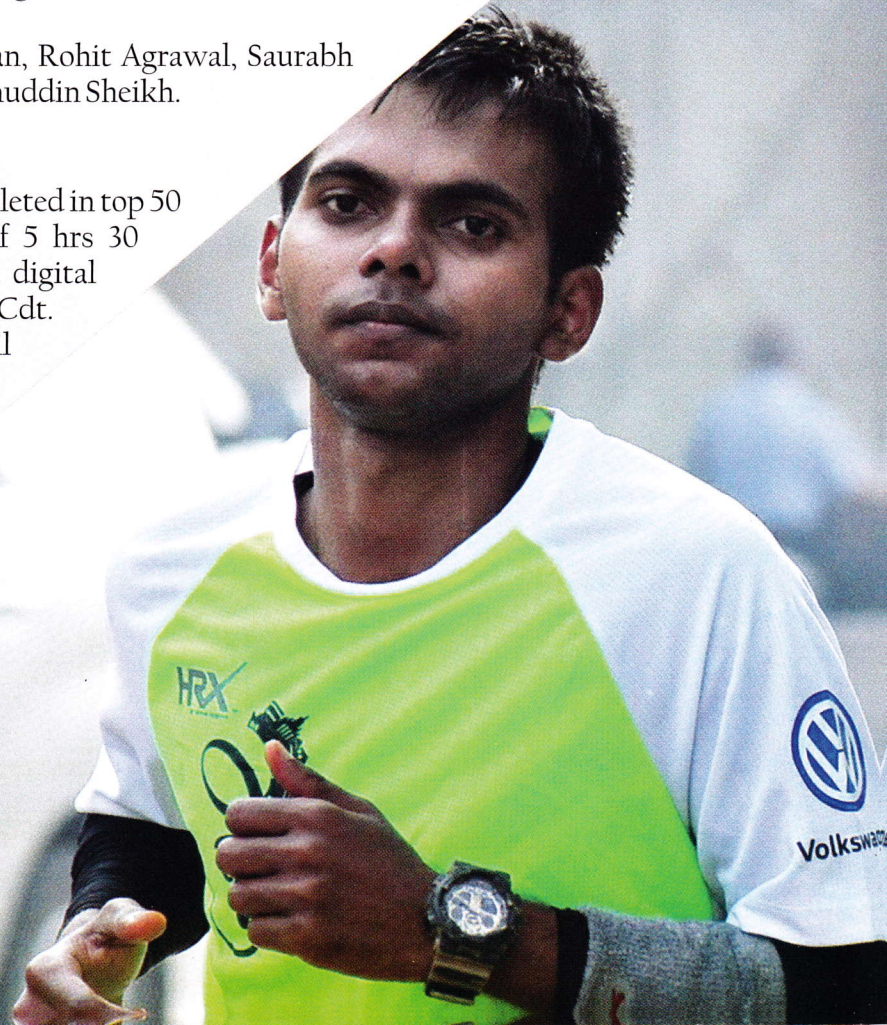

## A NEW FEATHER IN THE CAPS OF OUR FACULTY MEMBERS

Mr Sanjay Dabadgaonkar is a Senior Associate Professor in Department of Electrical and Electronics at our Institute and a fellow member of Institution of Engineers and of Institution of Electronics and Telecommunication Engineers. His paper titled "Harmonic Mitigation in VFD used for Seawater Cooling System Pumps On-board Ships." was selected for the International Maritime Conference and Exhibition (INMARCO) held in Mumbai. This paper adds further brilliance to his long list of more than 50 paper presentations in International/National Conferences and 15 papers in Inter-national/National Journals.
